The Annual Report presents a brief account of the Academic and Extra-curricular activities organized by the various departments and committees of Vasant Kanya Mahavidyalaya, Kamachha, Varanasi during the academic session 2022-23. The report is divided into five sections. The first section introduces the Vision and Mission of the college. It also sheds light on the course structure, admission policy, and the students' enrollment in various courses. The second section presents a detailed description of the student - centric activities taken up by the various departments of the college. The significant achievements of VKM students are summarized in section three. Whereas, section four show-cases the endeavours of various committees of the college to uplift and embellish the talent of the students. Lastly, section five presents glimpse of the important days celebrated here to aware and sensitize the young minds about the issues of social and national importance.

Section 1: Introduction

Inaugurated on 10th July, 1954 by Dr. C.P. Ramaswamy Iyer, the then Vice-Chancellor of Banaras Hindu University, Vasant Kanya Mahavidyalaya, is continuously expanding its efficiency and impact in imparting quality education to women. It draws inspiration from the vision of Dr. Annie Besant, Mahamana Madan Mohan Malaviya, Dr. Rohit Mehta and other visionaries and educationists, who worked to link up education with culture and balance freedom with responsibility. With a holistic end in mind, the college pursues the motto “education as service”, so that the students become responsible citizens, able to serve the community. The academic and the extra-curricular events brace the young girls to understand and address the challenges of the ever-changing society.

A group of extremely efficient, committed and qualified faculty members (45) appointed as per UGC norms, under the able-administration of the principal, have successfully strived to achieve the goals for which the college has been established. The college at present is teaching 15 subjects in Arts and Social Science streams at UG level i.e. **English, Sanskrit, Hindi, Philosophy, AIHC & Archaeology, Music (Vocal), Music (Instrumental), Painting, Home Science, History, Political Science, Sociology, Psychology, Economics, Geography** along with PG and Ph.D courses in **11 subjects** except *Music (Vocal), Music (Instrumental), Painting, and Geography*. The college also runs four certificate courses under self-financing scheme i.e., **Spoken English, Fashion Designing, Certificate Course in Yoga Training, Value-added course on Theosophy, and Skill Development Programme for Sampling Tailoring/Sewing Machine Operator under UPSDM Scheme.**

The college enrolls students through All India Entrance Test conducted by BHU. It follows the reservation policy of the Government of India in admission. SC/ST, OBC & PH are accordingly admitted in various UG, PG, and Ph.d courses. The excellent academic reputation of the college draws students from all over the country. During this session students from 21 states, including north-east & southern states of India, were enrolled in different courses. The multi-cultural nature of the student fraternity enables the young minds to imbibe the rich cultural heritage of India and contributes significantly in the sustenance of pluralistic society.

In the academic session 2022-23, 1463 students were enrolled in the undergraduate courses and 626 in post-graduate courses. Besides this the college has 37 active research scholars registered under various faculty members. Certificate courses also attract a good number of students. 26 students were enrolled in Fashion Designing Certificate Course and 03 students in Spoken English Certificate Course, 33 students in Certificate Course in Yoga Training and 129 students were enrolled in the Value-added course on Theosophy. The college has also started an add-on course

titled 'Professional and Life Skills' run by the Young Skilled India Foundation to improve the employability of its students. 10 students registered for the course in the first batch. The college makes continuous efforts to optimize the human resource it has.

Infrastructure

The College has reasonably good infrastructure having smart class rooms, laboratories, library, canteen etc. The College is also equipped with elevator and stilt parking facility. The following additions have been made to upgrade the infrastructure during this session.

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Section 2: Student - Centric Activities

Section-4 Committee Report:

The extracurricular activities and outreach programs organized by the College during the academic year 2022-23 are appended below:

- SARJANA** - In the academic year 2022-23 college cultural forum Sarjana organized 22 competitions in various categories. The theme for this year's competitions was 'Reigning with Smile'. This year Sarjana included few new-age competitions such as Stand-up Comedy, Logo making, Documentary film, Music Composition, Business Planning, Picture-Story Narration, Zero Waste along with traditional ones such as Mehendi, Rangoli-making, Dance, Singing, Debate, Turn coat, Elocution, Poetry-recitation, GK quiz, Essay -writing , Theatre, etc.

Topics/theme for competitions covered a wide range of subjects, i.e. Developing Kashi, NEP 2020, Re-writing of History, Urban stress, Freedom & Discipline, Confusion & Excellence, Decay of libraries, Importance of philosophers in the society, E- commerce, Climate change, Eco- tourism etc. Entries for different competitions were collected through online forms and feedback was also taken from students regarding their experience of Sarjana-2023. We tried to analyze the data received through these forms through which following observations were made-

* A gap was seen among those who initially filled online participation form and those who actually turned-up as participants. It shows lack of preparedness and casual attitude for co-curricular activities.

* Lack of imagination, creative and critical thinking is evident.

* Lack of humour and healthy comedy indicates increased level of stress and poor coping mechanism at individual level.

* Creative performing arts (theatre activities) are not being taken up as serious affair.

* Habit of debating needs to be promoted for analytical thinking.

On the management side, three student coordinators and a team of 70 volunteers divided into six subcommittees were constituted to facilitate the whole event. In different categories, 30 first, 32 second, 30 third and 25 consolation prizes were bagged by students for different competitions.

This year we received a huge sponsorship of 47,500/- rupees from SBI, Rathyatra- Varanasi branch for purchase of trophies.

The closing ceremony of Sarjana 2023 was organized on 17.02.23 in the presence of hon. Manager smt. Uma Bhattacharyya, ho. Principal prof. Rachna Srivastava. It was well attended by all the faculty members of the college. Parents of students were also invited. Prof. Anupam Kumar Nema, Student Advisor, BHU was the chief guest and CHR SBI, Rathyatra Varanasi miss Awantika was special guest on the occasion. The title of 'Youth Icon' was conferred to Miss Ragini Sarna of 'Shilpayan' Sangeet Sanstha and illustrious alumni of the college.

Program was enthusiastically attended by 500 students and their parents.

It commenced with yoga exercises under the direction of ‘Sahaja Yoga Sanstha’ on the banks of the Ganga Ghat. After this, the volunteers started "Heritage Walk" from Assi Ghat and reached the birthplace of Laxmibai and got acquainted with the strong personality of Veerangana Laxmibai. While returning to college, the volunteers spread awareness

for road safety. After reaching the college, a plantation drive was carried out in college. The students planted saplings and re-painted the old pots. The entire program was completed under the leadership of the five program officers.

On 15.02.2023, **Blood Donation Camp** in collaboration with the Institute of Medical Science was organized on college premises in which 60 volunteers donated blood. Dr. Ashutosh Kumar Singh's team from Blood Bank, BHU co-ordinated the blood donation camp, he discussed the importance of blood donation and some health risks associated with it. Nearly 225 volunteers registered to donate blood out of which 60 volunteers and Programme Officer Dr. Aarti Kumari donated blood.

In the first session of the 6th day of the seven-day special camp organized by the National Service Scheme, Vasant Kanya Mahavidyalaya. Mrs. Richa Ranjan, Environmentalist and former Vice President, Morgan Stanley Multinational Company, New York, delivered a lecture on the topic "Millets and Health". She discussed the importance of millets for healthy food habits and also expounded on other important aspects of Health and nutrition emphasising minimizing salt and sugar in our food. She also elaborated on the factors helpful in the physical, mental, intellectual and spiritual development of man. Delivering a lecture on "Relevance of G20 summit for India", Prof. Indu Upadhyay, Department of Economics, described this conference as a suitable opportunity for India to emerge as a leader on the global stage. At such a time there is a need to formulate a global policy. G20 is a group of influential countries which will formulate a global policy to control the fluctuations in world trade. She discussed how today's emerging middle-class consumer, Natural resources, skilled manpower and the demographic dividend will pave the way for making India a Vishwa Guru through G20 as a means. In the third session, a quiz competition was organized on "G20 Summit" in which about 10 teams of volunteers participated. In the fourth session, the volunteers volunteered to clean the amphitheatre ground of the college. The sixth day camp was concluded with the national anthem.

The closing ceremony of the seven-day camp organized by Vasant Kanya Mahavidyalaya concluded on 17 February 2023. The students presented cultural programmes, street plays, poetry recitations etc. Vaishnavi of Unit III recited a poem on "Youth". The students who won in various competitions were felicitated in the ceremony.

- 3. UNNAT BHARAT ABHIYAN (UBA)** – UBA is an ambitious outreach programme launched by Ministry of Human Resource Development in 2014. Most of the Central Universities and Colleges are associated with this programme. Vasant Kanya Mahavidyalaya, joined the programme in 2018 and since then making significant contributions in uplifting and empowering the village life.

Student Feedback Analysis Report 2022-23

Vasant Kanya Mahavidyalaya, Kamachha

The Vasant Kanya Mahavidyalaya in Kamachha aims to combine the values of tradition and modernity and is a model of quality and innovation. The college's IQAC, which prioritizes quality nourishment, has created a feedback system to gather student input for ongoing enhancements to the curriculum and its enrichment. Important student comments, ideas, and observations about the applicability of the curriculum, syllabi, and other administrative operations were gathered and compiled at the institutional level, and they were taken note of for future action. The data that the students supplied was kept private and utilized as valuable input to raise the caliber of the college's numerous programs. The salient takeaway points given by the students showed that the students were

very much satisfied with the Academic and Curriculum, Assessment and Evaluation, Students Support provided by the college, and Infrastructure.

The students' feedback for 2022-23 was collected through Google forms from the final year students of Undergraduate and Postgraduate from all disciplines. A total of 326 responses were collected including UG and PG students. The feedback form was based on four major broad areas i.e., **Academic and Curriculum, Assessment and Evaluation, Students Support provided by the college, and Infrastructure**. The four broad areas consisted of fifty-one well-structured questions focusing on the overall development of the students. The parameters which were emphasised in the four major broad areas of student feedback form were quality of teaching and learning process, examination and evaluation system, amenities (library, N-List, Wi-Fi access), sports and cultural activities, the effectiveness of training and internship for placement, canteen and water drinking facilities, administration and office facilities, grievance redressal mechanism, community services, mentoring programs, ICT facilities, field visits, college website, entrepreneurial activities, stimulation for innovative thinking, critical thinking and problem-solving competence, IQAC and NAAC awareness,

Chart 1: Class-wise classification of student respondents

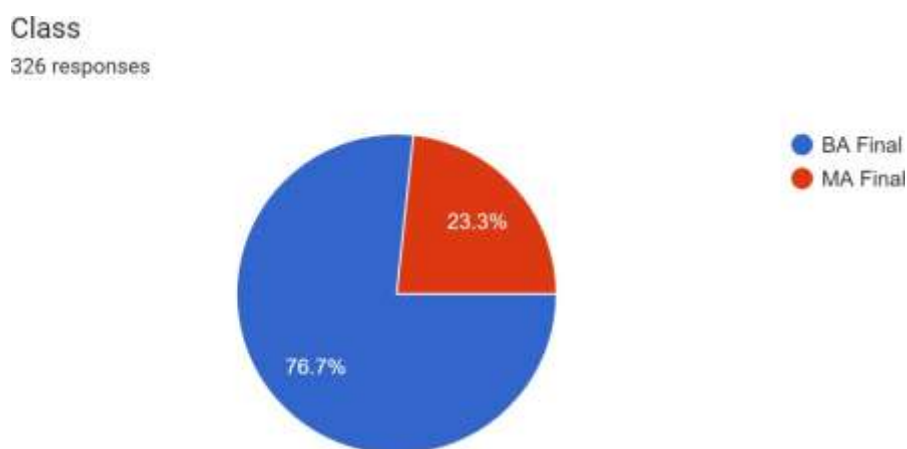


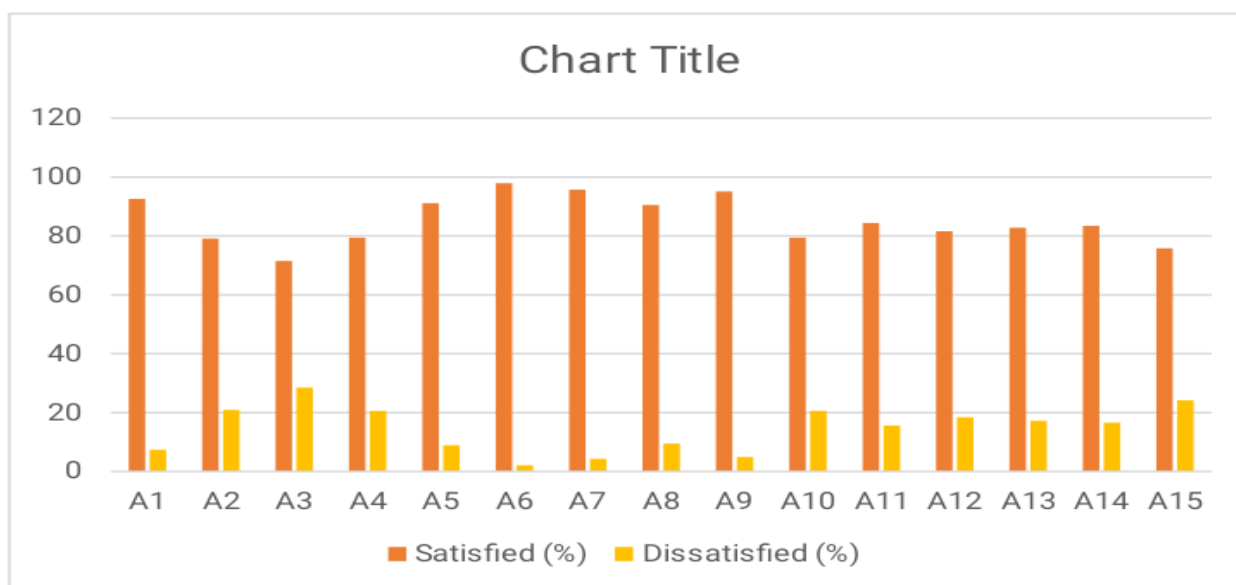
Chart 1 depicts the class-wise classification of student responses. It was noticed that 76.7 percent of responses (250 students) were given by Undergraduate students and 23.3 percent of responses (76) were recorded by Postgraduate students.

Chart 2: Academics and Curriculum



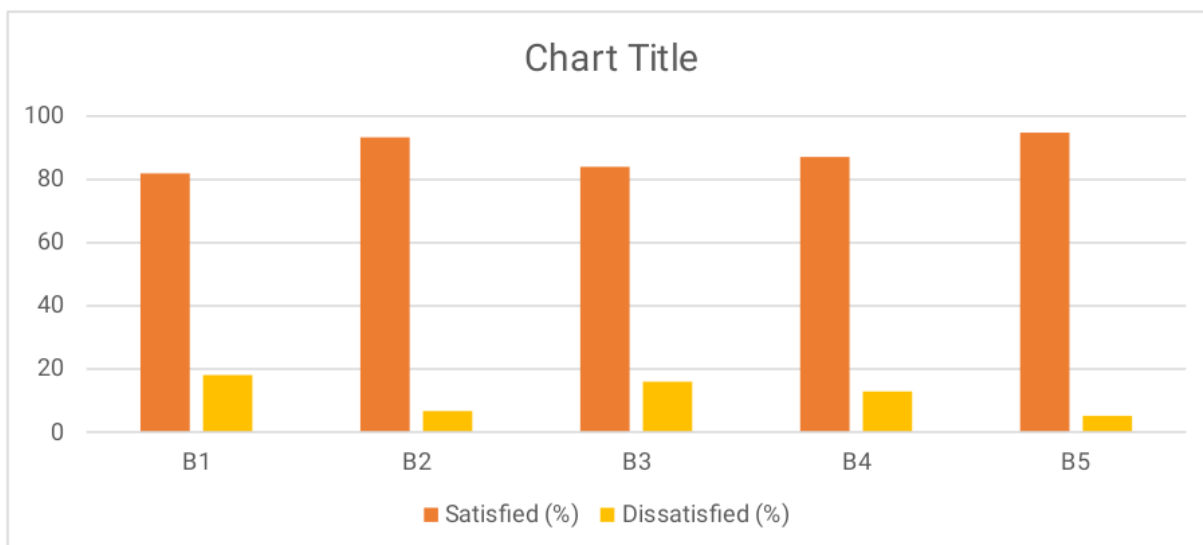
Section 1 was related to student's feedback regarding Academic and curriculum. It is cleared from the analysis of the table that 92.6 percent of the student were satisfied with the curriculum and they found it comprehensive, relevant, and properly arranged while very few students (7.4 percent) were found to be dissatisfied. According to 79.1 percent of the students, the content of the syllabus was covered in the class. The analysis showed that 71.5 percent of the students were satisfied with the usage of teaching aids and ICT in the class by the teachers to facilitate the teaching process. However, 28.5 percent of the students expressed their concern for further improvement. 79.4 percent of students agreed that the curriculum was effective in enhancing teamwork while 20.6 percent disagreed. 91.1 percent of the students accepted that the curriculum is relevant to real-life situations and reflects the current trends and practices in the respective disciplines, whereas very few 8.9 percent students expected improvements. A majority of students i.e. 97.9 percent agreed that the faculty came well prepared for teaching the class and 95.7 percent of students accepted that the faculty members provide additional practical examples

from real-life situations apart from the textbook. According to 90.5 percent of students, the faculty members provided an updated list of study material for reference i.e. textbooks/journals/magazines, etc. and the majority of students 95.1 percent were satisfied with the interactive and supportive teaching and learning approach. It was interpreted from the analysis that 79.4 percent of students were of the view that diverse teaching learning methods like group discussion, class discussion, case study, etc. were adopted to achieve the intended learning outcome, although 20.6 percent of students did not agree with the same. Most of the students (84.4 percent) reported that guidance was provided by faculty for writing research assignments, research papers etc. However, 15.6 percent of students indicated that they did not receive any guidance for writing research assignments, research papers, etc. 81.6 percent of students experienced the integration of theory and practical in classes while the rest of the students disagreed with the same. The stimulation for innovative thinking, critical thinking and problem-solving competency was observed by 82.8 percent of students whereas it was not found in 17.2 percent of students. 83.4 percent students claimed that their leadership, time management, and communication skills were developed and enhanced during their study and 16.6 disagreed with it. It was observed that almost 75.8 percent of students developed entrepreneurial/job skills during their study.

Chart 3: Assessment and Evaluation



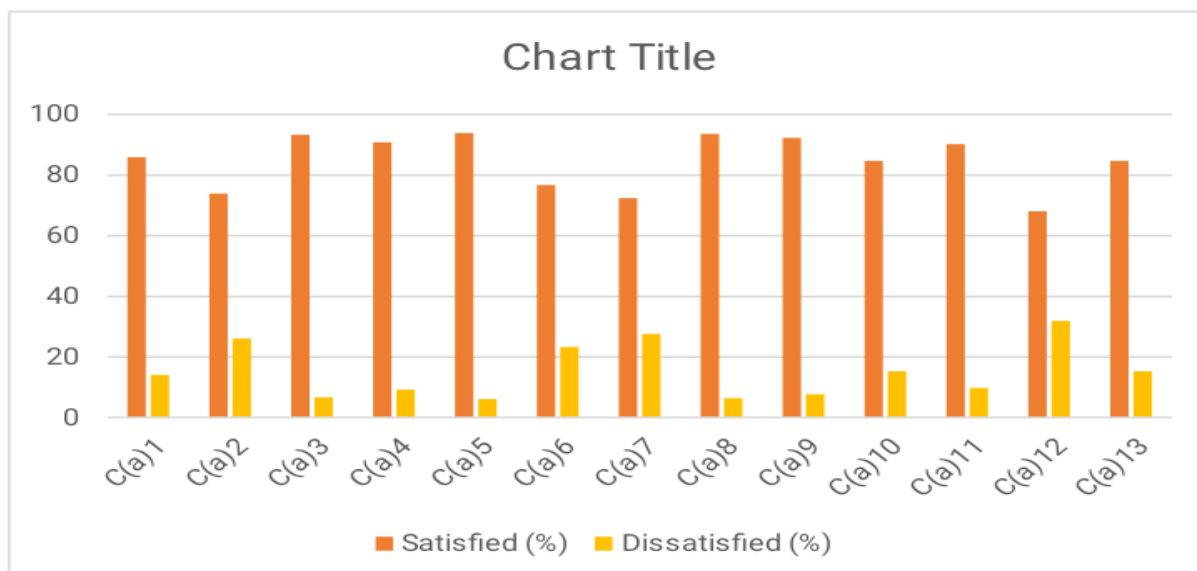
Section II represents the students' feedback regarding **Assessment and Evaluation**, which consists of five questions covering its various dimensions. The data in **table 2** indicated that 81.9 percent of students agreed that the frequency, method, and criteria of assessment including the grading criteria were clearly communicated to the students on the commencement of examination; moreover 18.1 percent of students did not agree with the same. 93.3 percent of the students accepted that the assignments/projects given were relevant and useful and helped them in improving their understanding and application of the subject matter. Most of the students (84.0 percent) were satisfied by the fair and timely feedback provided on each assessment before the next one; conversely, only 16.0 percent of students were not satisfied. It was observed that 87.1 percent of students reported that the internal evaluation system was without any discrimination or prejudices. A significant majority of 94.8 percent of students reported that examinations were conducted in a fair, disciplined, and organised manner.

Chart 4 (i): Students Support Provided by the College

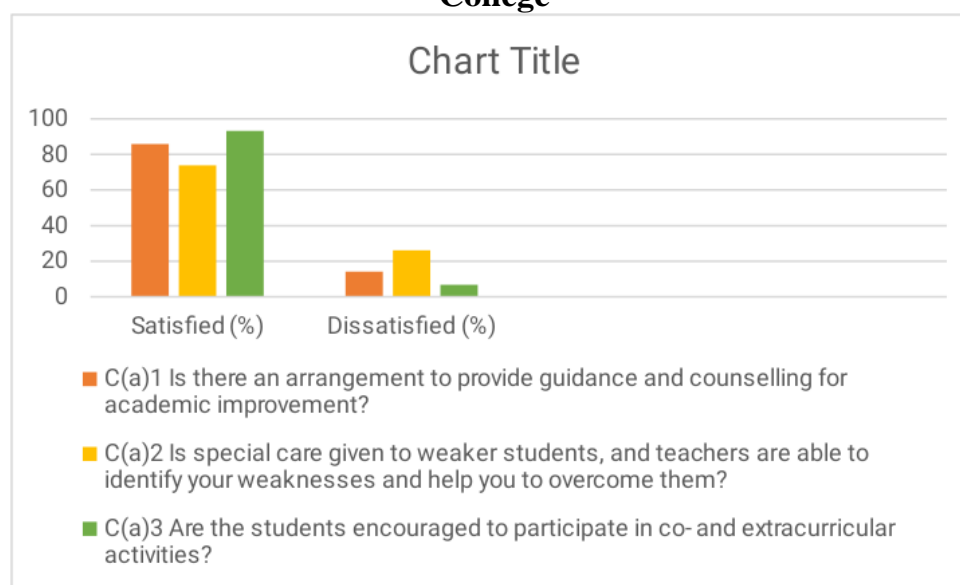


Section III represents the students' feedback regarding **Students Support Provided by the College**, which consists of sixteen questions C(a) & C(b). Our institution gives much significance and support to the students to pursue various activities in the college for their holistic development. As it is evident from table C(a), 85.9 percent of students' responses stated that there was an arrangement to provide guidance and counselling for academic improvement and 73.9 percent of students felt that special care was given to weaker students, and teachers were able to identify their weaknesses and help them to overcome them. A significant majority of students i.e. 93.3 percent and 90.8 percent expressed that they were encouraged to participate in extracurricular activities and encouraged to participate in community services respectively. It was observed that only 6.1 percent of students were unaware of the NSS Program being run in the college, whereas 93.9 percent of students were aware of it. It was found 76.7 percent of students were aware of the grievance redressal cell in college, alternatively 23.3 percent of students were unaware about the grievance redressal cell. According to 72.4 percent of students the mentor-mentee program was conducted regularly whereas 27.6 percent of students were unfamiliar with the same. A majority of students, 93.6 percent, found the orientation program very helpful and 92.3 percent of students reported that the institute takes an active interest in promoting internship and field visit opportunities for the students. It was reported by 84.7 percent of students that the faculty members make efforts to inculcate soft skills, life skills, and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work. It was told by 90.2 percent of students that they receive mark sheets on time from BHU, while 9.8 percent of students did not accept the same. It was revealed from the data that 31.9 percent of students were unaware of IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell) whereas 68.1 percent of students were familiar with IQAC. It is evident from the data that 84.7 percent of students were aware of NAAC, in contrast 15.3 percent of students were unfamiliar with it.

Chart 4 (ii): Students Support provided by the College



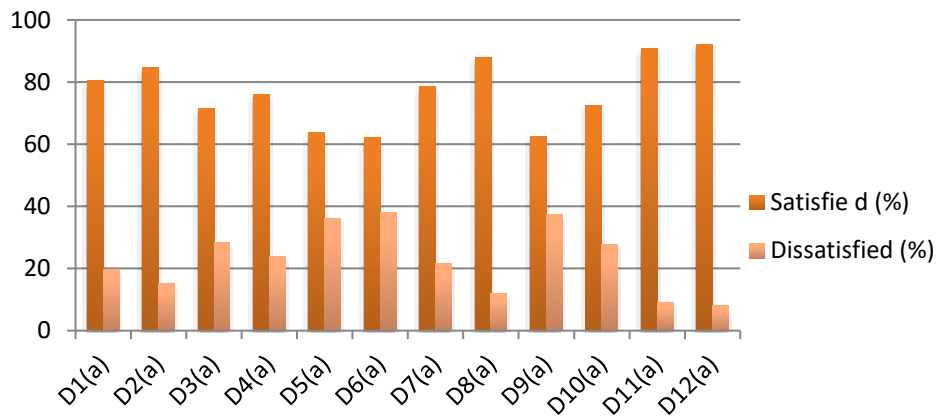
Above chart C4(ii) shows the students' experience with the admission process, administrative staff, and placement cell of the college. It was found that 33.4 percent of students had an excellent experience with the admission process. 47.2 percent of students said that they had a good experience with the admission process, whereas

18.7 percent of students found it average. Moreover, it was a bad experience for only 0.6 percent of students. It was noticed that the experience of 26.1 percent of students was excellent with the administrative staff and 46.0 percent of students responded that their experience was good with the administrative staff. 23.3 percent of students said it was an average experience. while 2.8 percent student have bad experience. According to 16.9 percent of students, the placement cell of the college was excellent. 39.9 percent of students experienced it as good, whereas 25.8 percent of students had an average experience. only 3.1 of students have bad experience with placement cell.

Section IV was formulated to obtain students' feedback regarding **Infrastructure**, which consisted of fifteen questions covering its various dimensions.

In the feedback survey, as depicted in the table D(a) 80.4 percent of students believed that the college has good classroom facilities, projectors, proper seating arrangements, computer labs etc., whereas 19.6 percent of students believed that all these arrangements are not good and need some improvement. About 84.7 percent students said that they had a full facility to use a computer lab and 71.5 percent students said that internet facility is available for study when required. However, 15.3 percent of the students said that they had no access to use a computer lab and 28.5 percent students said that they had no access to internet facility. In the present time, the importance of e-resources for studies has increased a lot and expanded rapidly since the time of Covid 19. Most students, 76.1 percent, revealed that e-resources in the library were easily accessible whereas 23.9 percent of students did not agree with the same. When the students were asked whether they knew about the N-list, majority of the student's 63.8 percent of them responded that they were familiar with it, alternatively, 36.2 percent of students were not aware of the N-list. The facility of N

- list has been started by our college library in which students can easily access important journals and papers. It was argued by 62.1 percent of students that they frequently use N-List while 37.9 percent do not access it. 78.5 percent students said that they knew about the digital library of the college, which is accessible 24x7 even from outside the college, whereas 21.5 percent of students were unaware of it.

The library timing was adequate for 88.00 percent of students while it was not adequate for 12.00 percent of students. It was found that 62.6 percent of students were satisfied with the cleanliness and proper maintenance of classroom/washroom common areas in the college, on the contrary, 37.4 percent of students were unsatisfied. Our institution provides much significance and support to the students to pursue sports activities. The analysis indicated that 72.4 percent of students were satisfied with the indoor and outdoor sports and recreational facilities while 27.6 percent of students expected more exposure and opportunities. A significant majority of students, 90.8 percent found the college website informative. Most students, 92.0 percent, said that they were made aware of the Covid-19 protocol by the college administration to be followed by them in the college campus.

Chart 5 (ii): Infrastructure

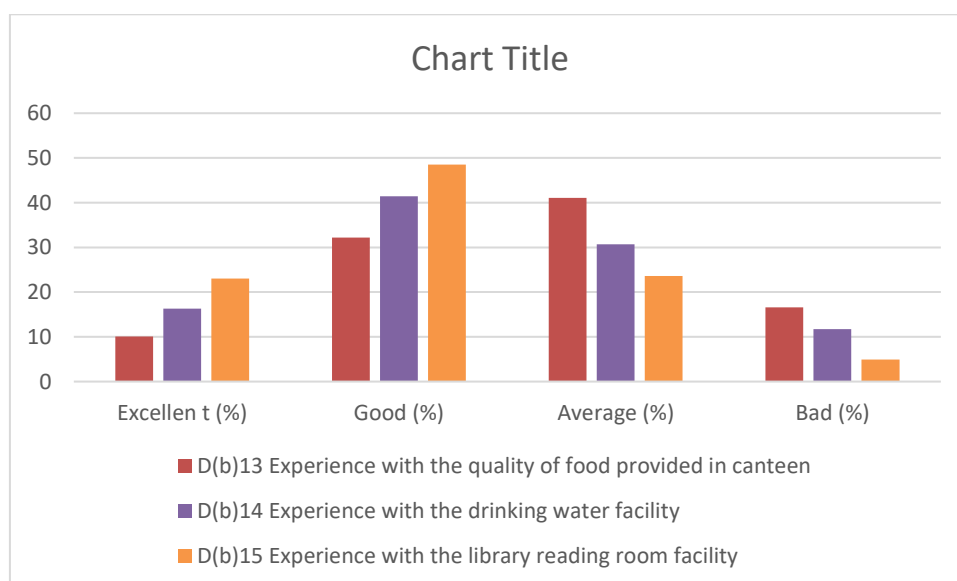


Chart 5 (ii) explains the experience of the students with the quality of food provided in the canteen, drinking water facility, and library reading room facility. 10.1 percent of students experienced food quality as excellent, and 32.2 percent of students found it good. It was an average experience of 41.1 percent of students whereas 16.6 percent of students had a bad experience with the food quality. It was noticed that 16.3 percent of students found the drinking facility excellent, and 41.4 percent of students responded to it as good. 30.7 percent of students said it was average whereas 11.7 percent of students had a bad experience. The library reading room facility was excellent for nearly 23.0 percent of students whereas it was a good experience for 48.5 percent of students. 23.6 percent of students reported it as average, and only 4.9 percent of students had a bad experience with the library reading room facilities.
