The Seven Day NSS Camp was organized in hybrid mode from 18.3.2021 to 24.03.2021.

Three members of the College were awarded Research Projects in 2020-21 by ICSSR under IMPRESS Scheme. They are Prof. Rachna Srivastava (Principal, VKM), Dr. Anshu Shukla and Dr. Sunita Dixit (Assistant Professors in Home Science).

Various academic initiatives were taken by faculty members. During the session 10 books; 19 chapters in books; 28 papers in peer reviewed journals were published. 295 papers were presented in National and International webinars by faculty members. 11 faculty members participated in Refresher Course and Faculty Development Programmes.

In the current academic session i.e. 2020-21 due to the extraordinary conditions created by COVID-19 pandemic, as per BHU & UGC guidelines, classes were conducted through online mode from 10th September, 2020. During the COVID-19 pandemic, to carry on educational activities and life-skill programmes regularly, innovative and virtual platforms were used.

CURRICULAR ASPECTS

1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

The college, affiliated to Banaras Hindu University, follows the curriculum developed by the University Board of Studies. Our faculty members actively participate in discussions regarding changes / modifications in the curriculum. For the effective implementation of the curriculum, in the beginning of the session, the Principal organises a meeting with the Heads of Department to discuss various strategies. Teachers are motivated to use innovative methods of teaching such as interactive lectures, group discussions, presentations, workshops, etc. The staff members of various departments conduct internal meetings and develop plans for the coming academic year. The library regularly procures new books according to the requirement of the syllabus. The curriculum is further supported by educational tours/industry visits and other implicative methods developed by the faculty members of the college. The teachers are regularly in touch with their respective departments/faculties of the University regarding the successful implementation of the curriculum. The latter are quite considerate in updating and enhancing knowledge of students through quest lectures for the newly introduced topics. The faculty members of our college regularly attend meetings, workshops, orientation, refresher programmes. The college also provides ICT tools, viz. object cameras, laptops, LED projectors etc. to the faculty as per their requirements. The faculty organize guest lectures, workshops and academic tours. The college has a fully automated library with latest books, CDs, access to N-List through INFLIBNET, relevant magazines and newspapers. Systematic documentation is maintained to review the outcomes of the curriculum. If at any step, the college realizes that the laid objectives are not being achieved, it plans for a remedial action and strategies are devised to cover up the gaps. The institution has formed communication channels among all stakeholders to ensure that objectives of the curriculum are achieved in the course of implementation. Once the academic session is in full swing and all the laid action plans are followed, the college at various points, takes stock of the effectiveness of these action plans. Also, the college ensures that during the course of implementation, the stated objectives

of the curriculum are achieved. To do this, various tests are conducted to monitor the outcomes of the syllabus. The college encourages various stakeholders such as students, alumni, faculty to give their feedback and communicates it to the concerned departments of the university through suitable channels. The feedback in the form of interactions, discussions and suggestions is analysed by co-ordinators of various committees. The college collects all feedbacks and communications from its stakeholders which are then analyzed and inferences are drawn from them. The feedbacks are discussed in the staff meetings.

1.1.2 - The institution adheres to the academic calendar including for the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)

Our University provides the Academic Calendar for each academic session - odd & even semesters specifying the teaching days, and dates for semester break, semester exam, marks to be sent by the college and declaration of results. The college follows the academic calendar of B.H.U. It makes sustained efforts to inform students with the help of learner centered teaching methods.

The college also prepares an internal academic calendar in accordance with the calendar sent by BHU to determine the dates for various cultural, academic and sports events with the active involvement of the heads of various departments and the college committee under the guidance of the Principal. Every faculty implements a time-bound teaching-plan decided at the time of the commencement of the academic calendar. All the faculty members in a department interact and coordinate with each other from time to time, with an intent to evaluate the rate of progress in teaching and the areas of syllabus covered. Students are informed about the evaluation procedure and the academic calendar of the university at the beginning of each session through orientation programmes specially designed for them.

To integrate the academic programmes and institution's goals, our college has taken the following initiatives to supplement the University's curriculum:

- Every faculty implements a time-bound teaching-plan decided at the time of the commencement of the academic calendar.
- All the faculty members in a department interact and coordinate with each other from time to time, with an intent to evaluate the rate of progress in teaching and the areas of syllabus

- covered. At the beginning of the session, the students are apprised about the tentative division of teaching of a particular paper.
- The College Committee and IQAC, along with the Principal, hold meetings with teachers to formulate the schedule of internal evaluation, keeping in view the academic calendar of the university.
- Marks of internal and external assessments are duly displayed on the students' notice board.
- To ensure transparency in evaluation system, answer-sheets are shown to the students as per their request.
- The marks awarded in internal and external assessments are uploaded online on the BHU students' portal well in time.
- Guest Lectures, Seminars, Workshops, Training Programmes and Industrial Visits are conducted to impart awareness of the current industrial demands. The college offers various avenues to the students such as projects/dissertations, presentations, assignments, group discussions, seminars, written/oral tests, quiz etc.
- The College lays impetus on Spoken English and computer literacy to inculcate good communicative and presentation skills amongst the students.
- Educational tours are organized to develop interpersonal relationships and to promote awareness about the cultural heritage of our country.
- NSS is an additional facility which inculcates social responsibilities, team work and community orientation amongst the students. Various academic and cultural competitions are conducted for creative and all-round development of the students.
- Two certificate courses are offered to the students as add-on programmes to supplement the curriculum provided by the University so as to ensure more employability to the students.
- Red Ribbon Club, functioning in the College since 2013, takes up community services like blood donation.
- Competition Committee conducts debates on various contemporary issues and also prepares and sends students to competitions organized by other local institutions.

A number of steps have been taken to translate quality to its various units by the college. The prospective plans and policies are prepared by the IQAC based on the activities proposed by various departments for the academic calendar. The prospective plan is presented before the stakeholders (teachers and student representatives). A consensus is arrived at, finalized and submitted to the IQAC and college committee for scrutiny and implementation. An appraisal of the performance of the students, teachers and administrative staff is done regularly. The quality policy is reviewed through the feedback of all stakeholders. The Principal holds formal and informal dialogues with the staff, from time to time, to redress any grievance. Teachers are

encouraged to participate in seminars, conferences, workshops and refresher and orientation courses to update their knowledge and skill base.

1.3 - Curriculum Enrichment

1.3.1 - Institution integrates crosscutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability into the Curriculum

The University constantly upgrades its curriculum to integrate cross-cutting issues such as gender inequality, climate change, environmental education, human rights, ICT etc. The College, at its own level, makes arrangements for seminars and conferences wherein experts from the aforementioned fields are invited to share and deliver their experiences and knowledge. Following are the efforts made by the College in this direction:

- The Women's Study Forum of the College "Udaan" organizes invited talks on women related issues such as early marriage, physical and psychological harassment, gender inequality in home and workplace etc. "Udaan" aims to analyse and bring to light the various levels of female psyche or consciousness.
- The college regularly organizes National seminars on women empowerment, Human rights of Women, Environment, and Higher Education etc.

- A number of our faculty members regularly deliver lectures, present papers, publish research papers on the relevance of environmental education, human rights etc. Gender Sensitization and Environmental Education are an integral part of both UG and PG syllabi of BHU.
- The College offers various value-added courses/enrichment programmes for the holistic development of students as mentioned below:
- Annie Besant Spirit Progression Committee organizes a number of programmes throughout the year to inculcate moral and ethical values among students. The tools adopted by the committee for the progression of Annie Besant Spirit are :
- 1. Lectures: Various eminent scholars are invited to deliver lectures on the immortal philosophy of Dr. Annie Besant.
- 2. Tours: The students are taken to various places inhabited by Dr. Besant during her life in the Indian Section Headquarters of the Theosophical Society (Parent Body), Varanasi.
- 3. Course: Value Added Course on Self-Realization through Theosophy was introduced in 2018 to ensure holistic development of students.
 - The Placement Cell of the college organizes various training programmes for the students to increase their chances of employability.
 - The college offers Career Counselling for the students which provides better opportunities for employment. Various departments of the college regularly organize student seminars/ talks and train the participants in presentation skills.
 - The college offers certificate and diploma courses in Spoken English and Fashion Designing. These programmes ensure better career options to students.
 - Students are also allotted different responsibilities in organizing various events and activities such as cultural programmes, competitions, seminars, workshops etc. In this way they improve their team building and organizational skills.
 - The NSS units adoptsfive wards and visit surrounding areas and villages to spread awareness on various social, moral and ethical issues.
 - Under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, the college has adopted five villages viz. Badagaon, Khushipur, Kukaraha, Badiasanpur and Paharigaon, for spreading awareness on social issues and their development.
 - Students are encouraged to participate in intercollegiate programmes organized by other colleges which provide them with an opportunity to interact with fellow students and assimilate new knowledge.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

Every faculty implements a time bound teaching-plan decided at the time of the commencement of the academic calendar. All the faculty members in a department interact and coordinate with each other from time to time, with an intent to evaluate the rate of progress in teaching and the areas of syllabus covered. At the beginning of the session, the students are apprised about the tentative division of teaching of a particular paper. Teachers also act as mentors.

- Exposure of students to other institutions of higher learning/ corporate/ business house etc.
- Sincere efforts are made by the faculty of different departments of the college to enhance and supplement students' syllabus-based academic knowledge through excursions and study tours. These are conducted periodically by students and teachers visiting industrial organizations, manufacturing units, etc.
- The University faculty and experts from the industrial organizations are also invited for guest lectures/workshops/group discussions at the college premises for sharing their valuable knowledge and experience in different fields.
- Additionally, students are encouraged to participate actively in various seminars, workshops and competitions organized by other academic institutions.
- Slow learners are identified through regular classroom discussions following which they are given relevant feedback and also useful counseling for improved performance.
- Faculty members constantly provide extra help and assistance to students who are slow learners as and when required.
- Tutorials are conducted for weak students. Extra time is allotted to them by the faculty members in their free periods.
- Interactive sessions and 'catch up' classes are also held to supplement this effort.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

The learning activities encouraged by the various academic programmes are basically learner-centric as students are the major stakeholders in this process of Teaching-Learning & Evaluation. The college and faculty members, as facilitators, provide technological and knowledge-based support to students. Students have full access to the library and ICT in the form of computers and internet facilities available in the computer room. The Library is fully automated and accessible to the students. It has a rich collection of books in all subjects. Students are continuously encouraged by faculty to take part in quiz, group discussions, presentations. In class room seminars and workshops, students make presentations and ask questions. In order to improve their writing skills and independent learning, students are given assignments. Students of Social Science also write dissertation as part of their evaluation process. The following are some of the steps to promote experiential and participative learning:-

- Motivating and guiding undergraduate and post-graduate students to take up research topics in emerging areas to prepare their project/dissertation.
- Involving research scholars and post-graduate students in all the processes concerning research activities including organizing seminars, paper presentations etc.
- Arranging workshops and classes on research methodology by external experts.
- Organising National /State/College level seminars in emerging areas to arouse curiosity among the students as well as to get a chance to meet academic experts of the related areas.
- Students are further encouraged to visit departments of universities and colleges for exposure to advanced research.
- Subject exhibitions are organized by various departments which promote scientific temper.
- Apart from this, facilities like Wi-Fi, Internet, computer lab and rich library exist in the college to encourage and assist students in research activities.

- Enhancing library facilities by including research studies by eminent researchers to the existing stock, subscribing to national research journals and provision of free access to internet.
- Final year UG and PG students in some departments study research methodology through dissertation.
- Apart from classroom teaching, in order to inculcate a scientific temper, socio-economic surveys are conducted and educational tours taken by UG students to villages and national level institutions like IICT, IIHT, IPS, BLW etc.
- The college has developed class-rooms comprising LCD projector, computer and laptop, interactive boards, object cameras to make teaching more effective.

2.3.2 - Teachers use ICT enabled tools for effective teaching-learning process. Write description in maximum of 200 words

The demand of the semester system and the pandemic made the teachers adopt new methods of teaching besides the traditional method of chalk and talk. Understanding this, our teachers have been using a number of interactive methods which ensure continuous and quality involvement on the part of the students in the class. The college is also well-equipped with ICT Support. The college supplements the lecture method of teaching with ICT enabled tools like LCD Projectors, Object Cameras, Interactive Panel and softwares like SPSS, Super Lab and CAD. The English Department has a rich collection of DVDs of classic through which knowledge is imparted to students of both UG and PG for the paper of drama. Classes are conducted through audio-visual aids. Teachers of various departments make power-point presentations for effective learning and teaching. Online teaching platforms like Google Meet, Teachmintare used by the teachers as students are unable to come to the College. Google classrooms are used for teaching and evaluation purposes.

The library has been fully automated. The automation work, which started in the session 2010-11, was completed in the session 2015-16. The library uses customized programme LIBSYS. After full automation, the titles of books in the library can be easily accessed by the students online from anywhere in the college. This has helped in saving the time and energy of the students which was earlier used to access the books manually.

The students are informed at the very beginning of each session that their performance will be evaluated through written tests, assignments, quiz and viva voce (wherever applicable). They are acquainted with the pattern of the semester examination with respect to distribution of marks regarding internal and external examinations. The examination process follows a transparent method. Marks are duly displayed for the benefit of the students and also their grievances addressed. The university also provides for the display of answer sheets to the students who apply for the same through an established procedure. However, due to pandemic in the current academic session, examinations were conducted by the University in OBE mode and internal evaluation was done on the basis of assignments only. Also for intermediate semesters, students were promoted on the basis of assignment condcuted internally.

Teachers are made aware of the evaluation process prescribed by the University; any change made to it is communicated to all stake-holders at the very beginning of the session by the Principal and the IQAC. Teachers formulate an evaluation procedure and its time period in consultation with other faculty members of their own department and also from other departments. INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

Higher education is the key to fulfill intensive and extensive knowledge requirements for research and development. Infrastructure (especially technological infrastructure in the present knowledge era) plays a great role (as a tool) to achieve excellence in teaching and research. In order to create and enhance the infrastructure that facilitates effective teaching and learning, the policy is framed according to the strength of students in different streams. With the increase in strength, as per requirement, the institution approaches UGC and seeks various funds. The Institution gets financial assistance from UGC under every plan. The infrastructural enhancement is liberally funded on need base and on the availability of the funds. Moreover, at the institutional level, it is our constant endeavor to do as much as we can for the creation and enhancement of infrastructure that facilitates effective teaching and learning. The college has adopted techniques to make teaching more effective. Apart from this, facilities like Wi-Fi, Internet, computer lab and an enriched library are available in the institution to encourage and assist students in learning. 33 Classrooms, 3 Staff rooms, 1 Conference Hall, 1 Computer Lab, 1 Common room, 1 Canteen have been constructed by the college. A number of steps have been taken to renovate classrooms, lab, office etc. to improve the effectiveness of teaching and other academic activities. The classrooms have the provisions of LCD projectors, portable LCD projector,

multimedia learning tools, object camera, interactive board, Wi-Fi connectivity and internet access.

- Seminar Hall: The college has one well-equipped seminar hall. This hall is regularly used for conducting college, state and national level seminars. The students of both UG and PG are regularly encouraged for active involvement in paper presentations, group-discussions etc.
- Laboratories- The Departments of Psychology , Home Science and Geography have well equipped labs. The institution plans to construct a lab for Spoken English.
- Library -The College has a rich library which is fully automated. Photocopyfacility for students and staff is available in the library on payment basis. Open access to stack for PG students and research scholars is provided. A reading room with reference books, encyclopaedia, magazines, journals, periodicals, newspapers is open for both students and staff members. The reading room is also equipped with 4 computers with internet facility.

Thus, despite having limited physical infrastructure the college strives to make optimum utilization of these resources. Sports, cultural and academic activities are planned in such a manner as to put to optimum usage of the available playgrounds, halls, etc.
- The college also holds regular Yoga classes for students and interested teachers in the hall during morning hours.
- The college has five units of NSS. A number of seven days and one day NSS camps are organized in the amphitheatre ground situated in the Theosophical Society premises, which is the parent body of VKM. From time to time, the college stages plays and performances in the amphitheatre.

• Sports is an integral part of any academic institution to ensure the proper physical development of students. Since the inception of the college, students have participated in different types of games and have touched different levels of success as sportspersons. We have playground for outdoor games like volleyball, badminton, basketball, kabaddi and kho-kho. Facilities for indoor games like chess, carom etc, are provided to students in the college campus only.

4.4.2 - There are established systems and procedures for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc.

The institution has made adequate arrangements for the maintenance and upkeep of the college infrastructure. The management ensures that enough funds are allocated and then utilized for the maintenance. The Principal, on the basis of the prospective development plan, proposes the infrastructural augmentation needs to the concerned authorities. The UGC sanctions funds based on the requirements, student strength, and the nature of the academic programs offered by the institution. The college development fund is utilized for maintenance and minor repairs of furniture and equipments. An effective monitoring system, through various committees, ensures the optimal utilization of budget allocated. We have a building as well as maintenance committees to

oversee the requirements of the entire campus headed by the Principal with teachers and some office staff as members.

Annual maintenance and repair of the infrastructure is taken care of by the college in a systematic manner. Day to day maintenance is carried out by the staff appointed for cleaning and maintenance of the building. The computers and electronic devices are maintained and repaired through the funds available in the institution. The college has one efficient technical assistant who carries out the maintenance and calibration of computers and laptops in the college. Services of an electrician, carpenter and plumber are available as per requirement. Maintenance of generators is done by the service provider. Aquaguards and one multi-functional printer are under annual maintenance contracts.

There is no major problem of voltage fluctuation in the college campus. However equipments like AC, refrigerator, photocopier machines and computers have voltage stabilizers or UPS installed along with them. For constant water supply, two submersible pumps of 1.5 & 1 hp are installed. The College has 4 play grounds for organizing outdoor and Indoor games which are taken care of by the cleaning staff of the college.

The library has an Advisory Committee which consists of the Principal, Librarian, IQAC Coordinator and 4 faculty members, and two student representatives. Regular meetings of the Committee are held where committee members provide valuable inputs for the better functioning of the library. On the advice of the committee members, new and relevant journals, books, equipments and softwaresare procured with the funds made available by the UGC.

6.2 - Strategy Development and Deployment

6.2.1 - The institutional Strategic/ perspective plan is effectively deployed

In order to take care of all its thrust areas, the institution effectively deploys its strategic/perspective plans. The institution chalks out its academic terms and phases out teaching and examination programmes. Similarly, sports and cultural programmes are planned and executed as per the rules and regulations of the college as well as the university.

For its effective deployment, an academic calendar of the college is prepared in accordance with the academic calendar of BHU. In the beginning of the session, the Principal holds a meeting with the Heads of different departments as well as co-ordinators of different committees, to chalk out a plan for the implementation of all academic as well as cultural affairs. The Heads thereafter hold a meeting with their faculty members and decide the distribution of syllabus, time-table, dates of submission of assignments, testsetc. The coordinator and the co-coordinator of various committees chalk out plans for the organization of different events and competitions in coordination with other committee members. Students representatives also play significant roles in acting as bridge between faculty members and the students. In the year 2020-21, due to the spread of pandemic these activities and competitions were organized on the e- platform, for which various

The College is admitted to the privileges of Banaras Hindu University. 6.4.3 - Institutional strategies for mobilization of funds and the optimal utilization of resources

The College depends for its revenue requirements on UGC. 95% of the total expenditure is met by the grants provided by UGC whereas the remaining 5% is provided by the Management of the College. Alumni and prestigious members of the Society contribute by providing scholarships and fellowships to meritorious students. The Alumni Committee has accumulated a meagre fund through which it organizes the annual alumni meet. It proposes to hold seminars, workshops and enhancement of infrastructure etc. in the future. The college also raises some fund through fee and fine. During this session a grant of Rs.369000/- under the heads of projects sanctioned to three faculty members.

The financial resources of the college are managed in a very effective and efficient manner. There is both manual and computerized accounting system in the college. The following accounts are maintained:-

• Income and expenditure accounts

There are two types of payments /expenditures

- Salary
- Non-Salary

The college receives the following grants from the UGC -

- Plan Grant XII five year plan
- Non-plan Grant Salary, Non Salary
- Pension & Retirement Benefit

Each and every transaction is supported by vouchers. All the transactions are made through cheques and TSA. Only duly authorized persons, Principal & Manager can operate the bank account. Proper procedure for purchase is adopted. Quotations are called for and prices are compared. The institution has formed a Purchase Committee for this purpose. All the receipts and vouchers are initialled by the Purchase Committee, Principal and Manager.

The annual accounts are audited by a chartered accountant. For efficient use of financial resources, an annual budget is prepared and submitted to the UGC - the main funding agency.

The college is liberal yet follows the strategy of restraint as far as the expenditure is concerned. The regular audit of the budget also exercises check on the expenditure.

6.5 - Internal Quality Assurance System

6.5.1 - Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has contributed significantly for institutionalizing the quality assurance strategies and processes

The following programmes were conducted by the IQAC to ensure quality in the teaching-learning process :-

- In the session 2020-21, 78 online lectures, 13 webinars, 13 e-workshops were organized. Besides this, other online programmes with our stakeholders like Orientation Programmes, Farewell of students, International Yoga Day, Parent-Teachers Meet, e-Alumni Meet were also organized. The Seven Day NSS Camp was organized in hybrid mode from 18.3.2021 to 24.03.2021.
- Three members of the College were awarded Research Projects in 2020-21 by ICSSR under IMPRESS Scheme. They are Prof. Rachna Srivastava (Principal, VKM), Dr. Anshu Shukla and Dr. Sunita Dixit (Assistant Professors in Home Science).
- Various academic initiatives were taken by faculty members. During the session 10 books; 19 chapters in books; 28 papers in peer reviewed journals were published. 295 papers were presented in National and International webinars by faculty members. 11 faculty members participated in Refresher Course and Faculty Development Programmes.
- In the current academic session i.e. 2020-21 due to the extraordinary conditions created by COVID19 pandemic, as per BHU & UGC guidelines, classes were conducted through online mode from

- 10th September, 2020. During the COVID-19 pandemic, to carry on educational activities and life-skill programmes regularly, innovative and virtual platforms were used.
- Three MOUs were signed by the college with Social Action and Research Center (SARC) on 1.7.18 ,Vasanta College for Women, Rajghat, Varanasi on 1.07.2020 and Govt. M.H. College of Home Science and Science for Women, Jabalpur on 3.3.2021 for the next three years, in order to develop collaboration for counselling, training and other academic activities and to promote mutual understanding.
- From time to time IOAC held meetings with various stakeholders and obtained feedback.
- Feedback was taken from all the students in order to improve the teaching-learning progress.
- In order to increase the research aptitude of faculy and students various collaborative programmes were conducted.
- Various outreach programmes and educational visits were organized by the college to male the learning more sustainable and interesting. On 17.03.2021, 50 students of the college went on a field tour of Badisanpur where they conducted a survey of the village and interacted with students of Mahadeo PG College, Badiasanpur under the banner of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan. The students planted neem and mango saplings in the village and carries an awareness programme among the villagers. A conference on New Education Policy was also held at Mahadep PG College, Badiasanpur.
- A Seven Day International Workshop, from 21st to 25th July, 2020 was organized on "Stay Home, Stay Safe: Exploring Gender Equality in the New Normal". In the workshop, Dr. Archana Thakur, Joint Director, UGC, New Delhi shed light on various women empowerment programmes organized by UGC and discussed the directives for educational institutions for physical and mental development of women.
- An online "Two Day lecture Series" was organized on 11th and 12th June, 2020 on "New Assessment and Accreditation Policy of NAAC" by IQAC and NAAC. Prof. A. Vaishampayan, Emeritus Professor & Vice Chairman (IQAC), BHU, Former Director, Institute of Agricultural Sciences, BHU delivered his lecture on 11.06.2020, Dr. Binu Thomas, Associate Professor, Deptt. of Computer Application, Coordinator- IQAC, Joint Director of Marian Institute for Teaching-Learning and Evaluation, Kuttikkanam, Kerala and Prof. S.C. Sharma, Director, National Assessment and Accreditation Council, Bangalore were the resource persons on 12.06.2020.

The members of IQAC are invited quite frequently for assisting the departments in planning the academic activities as well as the action plans for improvement of teaching-learning process. In these designs, the members give their considered views in respect of formative tests, their formats, frequencies and nature. This obviously raises the level of the teaching-learning in terms of expectation of the university curriculum being implemented. IQAC also encourages the holding of inter-disciplinary lectures, workshops, field visits and also sports activities for the benefit of students and faculty.

The college follows a semester system. In each semester, periodical evaluation of the knowledge and grasp of student is obtained through summative and formative assessments. Regular assessment of students' performance is made through tests, assignments, practical & viva, presentations, classroom seminars, quiz sessions. Teachers get an idea of their students' strengths and weaknesses. This identification helps teachers to plan their teaching techniques accordingly and thus overcome the barriers of learning. Tutorial is provided to weak students, seminars, workshops, quest lectures, field visits, exhibitions are organized from time to time.

At the end of each session, the IQAC holds a meeting with the faculty wherein the feedback obtained by the students are discussed. Faculty members are required to fill the Annual Performace Appraisal Report (APAR) in which all their achievements are submitted. It has been found that there has been a significant improvement in the level of teaching, research, publications , organization of seminars and other activities.

Within the college premises, the students are free from any kind of sexual harassment, it being an institution for female candidates only. But, for any such potential threats outside the college premises, in today's risk-fraught society, provision is made by the college to instill such awareness in the students, through invited lectures and interactive sessions with field workers and NGO personnel under the banner of Udaan, the Womens' Study Cell of the college. SARJANA

Context: In the early nineties, a group of teachers specially from the departments of Hindi, English and Sanskrit, felt a need to rejuvenate themselves and redefine their role as teachers of

literature. It was felt that by passively conveying the opinions of critics and teaching literary theories, teachers of literature can never do justice to the art of arousing power of creativity lying dormant in the students. The desire to say and do something original and creative persistently enthused Dr.Savitri Srivastava, the then Head, Department of Hindi, along with likeminded colleagues to create a platform where they could give expression to their creativity.

Practice: This intense desire led them to form the core body of Sarjana comprising teachers and students of literature. It decided to meet once every month and 18th was the singled out date. Practice: Before starting the Cell "Udaan" in a formal shape, the college persistently encouraged the teachers and students to create a platform where activities on gender problems could be meaningfully addressed. Udaan has brought the students at the centre of activities. They are empowered to face the challenges of socio-cultural violence, economic and political marginalization. This vibrating platform ensures total students' participation in decision-making. The organizational setup involves both the students and staff members (Teaching & Non-Teaching).

Objectives :

- To empower the students to face the challenges of socio cultural violence, economic and political marginalisation.
- To open minds of students to issues and problems relating to the status and role of women in India.
- To make them aware of the differences in the treatment of the genders at home and at work place.
- To tutor students on laws set up to uphold their rights.
- To study the role and contribution of women in the evolution of society.
- To lay bare forms of oppression adopted against women.
- To bring the students at the centre of activities and to ensure their total participation in decision making.

Impact: Udaan is a forum which has created gender sensitization among not only students but also our staff members. The latest laws and developments in the area of women empowerment are discussed amongst students and teachers which enlighten them immensely. Udaan has, in previous years, invited social activists and eminent speakers to lay bare the reports of various committees formed especially to address women related issues. Students have also staged a number of shrutinataksaddressing various issues like women education, dowry deaths, rape victims, domestic violence and sex determination etc. All these activities have awakened and empowered students' confidence in meeting the various challenges that life may pose to them.

Activities of UDAAN in the session 2020-21:

A Seven Day International Workshop, from 21st to 25th July, 2020 was organized on "Stay Home, Stay Safe: Exploring Gender Equality in the New Normal". In the workshop, Dr. Archana Thakur, Joint Director, UGC, New Delhi shed light on various women empowerment programmes organized by UGC and discussed the directives for educational institutions for physical and mental development of women. Dr. Ranjana Sharma, Director, CSR, New Delhi, shared her views on gender discrimination and domestic violence. Dr. Aruna Boota, Psychiatrist, New Delhi, said that gender discrimination and mental harassment are socially unacceptable. Dr. Manju Agrawal, Professor and Head, Amity University held that gender discrimination prevents women from reaching their full potential. Dr. Puneet Gavli, Specialist, Digital Forensics, Information Security and Fraud Investigation gave an insightful lecture on cyber security and how to prevent cyber crime. Dr. Meenakshi Ingole, Assistant Professor, Department of Education, Delhi University discussed gender inequality and cyber crime and shed light on the role of family in society. Nidhi Bansal, Senior Director, Programme Operation Quality and Learning, New Delhi, discussed how family can change social hierarchy. Ms. Ranjana Gaur, Director, Social Work and Research Centre, Varanasi discussed child abuse and the role of quardians in preventing it. Dr. Anu Bhal Mehra, Associate Professor,

Department of Law, New Delhi gave information on laws for eradicating abuse of women. Sri Jayant Bhatt, Advocate, made the participants aware of gender discrimination laws. Dr. Amar Singh, Post-doctoral Fellow, Germany discussed that division of labour should not be on physical attributes but on values and thoughts. Miss Shilpi Sen, Journalist, discussed how women can use media in productive and non-productive ways and how they can improve their image with help of media. Sri Snehi Ranjan, Editor, Rashtriya Sahara highlighted in his lecture that women should be given equal opportunities in education so that they can make their own path.

On 28.06.2021, a programme on "Stand Up against street harassment" was organized by UDAAN. Sri Shubham Tiwari, Trainer, Breakthrough, was the resource person. 763 students participated in the event.
